


LANGUAGES OF LEARNING

The four components or skills for learning a language (e.g., English) are:

Listening - Speaking - Reading - Writing

Examples of 'languages of learning' (or methods) by which children learnt, and present what they learn:

I. Listening

- Story time (verbal or using books)
- Use of real objects
- Visits
- Give instructions and ask them to follow (can be played by two teams)

II. Speaking

- Narrating short phonic stories show the stories
- Re-telling the story
- Story Building
- Show and Tell
- Picture talk
- Just A Minute
- Sharing during Circle time

III. Reading

- Playing the treasure hunt game
- Bingo- (housie with pictures or print letters)
- Word –splash using illustration or objects
- Phonic shop
- Identifying sounds, words in news papers, magazines
- Creating words using letter cutouts
- Matching the letter/ word/sentence to the object/picture show couple of worksheets and letter box

IV. Writing

- Labeling the things in the environment
- To form as many words u can make from a given jumbled word for e.g.,: t r o c s a t b r e a t
- Form a longest sentence give example
- Write 5 things with the alphabet given alphabet/sound
- Fill in the blanks for the missing sound/alphabet/word show sample worksheet
- Dictation
- Word wall (can do it in their note-book)
- Write the meanings
- Copy writing
